Lindsay C. Jenkins serves as the Chief of the Criminal Division in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Northern District of Illinois. In this role, she supervises nearly 150 assistant U.S. attorneys and oversees the investigations and prosecutions by the Office across a wide range of practice areas, including corporate and securities fraud, terrorism, national security, cybercrime, public corruption, narcotics trafficking, civil rights violations, and violent and organized crime. Lindsay is responsible for approving the investigation, charging, plea and trial strategies for the office's most significant, complicated and high-profile prosecutions.

Lindsay first joined the U.S. Attorney's Office in 2006 and has served in several leadership roles including deputy chief of the Public Corruption Section, and Chief of the General Crimes and Violent Crimes Sections.

Lindsay has extensive litigation experience, having tried more than a dozen complex criminal cases to verdict in federal court, including mail and wire fraud offenses, financial institution fraud, corruption and narcotics trafficking. In addition, she briefed and argued many cases to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit.

Prior to joining the U.S. Attorney's Office, Lindsay served as a judicial law clerk to a federal district court judge in the Northern District of Ohio, and she was a litigation associate with Jones Day in Cleveland, Ohio
