Instead of settling, she began crafting her own waffles from real foods like fruits, veggies, and whole grains. What started as a late-night passion project turned into a mission: to make genuinely nourishing food more convenient for busy families. Five years later, Evergreen is sold in 8,000 stores nationwide, from Whole Foods and Sprouts to select Walmarts and Targets. Emily's story has been featured by Good Morning America, The Today Show, and The Wall Street Journal, among other publications.

Prior to founding Evergreen, Emily worked for Chef Grant Achatz and Nick Kokonas as the General Counsel for The Alinea Group and Tock.
